

#### **BYLAW NO. 4-2018**

### A BYLAW FOR ENACTING A FIRE RESTRICTION OR FIRE BAN

The Council of the District of Katepwa in the province of Saskatchewan may enact a Fire Ban or Fire Advisory, in consultation with the Balcarres Fire Department as indicated below:

#### 1. FIRE ADVISORY

Open burning in the municipality is not recommended due to dry conditions. Please use extreme caution when burning or using fireworks and have a plan to extinguish a fire to prevent a wild fire. The burning of debris, refuse, and construction materials is prohibited at all times within the boundaries of the District of Katepwa.

#### 2. FIRE BANS

Open burning in the municipality is banned due to dry, high risk fire spread conditions.

#### LEVEL 1 Fire Ban

Open burning in the District of Katepwa is banned.

Exemptions to a Level 1 Fire Ban, (with a plan to extinguish a fire) are:

- a. Solid Fuel Barbecues/Recreational Camp Fires (as per schedule A)
- b. Liquid fuel barbecues (propane or natural gas )
- c. Camp Stoves
- d. Fireworks

#### LEVEL 2 Fire Ban

Open burning in the District of Katepwa is banned.

A Level 2 Fire Ban includes:

a.) Fireworks

Exemptions to a level 2 fire ban, (with a plan to extinguish a fire) are:

- a.) Camp Stoves
- b.) Solid Fuel Barbecues/Recreational Camp Fires (as per schedule A)
- c.) Liquid fuel barbecues (propane or natural gas )

#### LEVEL 3 Fire Ban

Open burning in the District of Katepwa is banned. A Level 3 Fire Ban includes:

- a.) Camp Stoves
- b.) Solid Fuel Barbecues/Recreational Camp Fires (as per schedule A)
- c.) Fireworks

#### Exemptions to a Level 3 fire ban are:

a.) Liquid fuel barbecues (propane or natural gas)

## 3. OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

Every person who contravenes this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction up to \$1,500 in addition to fire fighting fees if required.

# Schedule A

To Bylaw 4-2018 A Bylaw for Enacting A Fire Restriction Or Fire Ban

# Solid Fuel Barbecues and Recreational Campfires are permitted under certain provisions of the Fire Ban Bylaw, providing:

- 1. Fires must be under constant supervision by an adult
- 2. Enclosed Fire pits or barbecues must be covered with a metal screen having openings no greater than 1/2" and must cover the entire opening. Logs or other fuel source must be fully contained within the enclosure. Embers and ash must be prevented from escaping the enclosure.
- 3. The fire pit/barbecue must be a distance of at least 20" from any grass, and 10 feet from any combustible structure or item.
- 4. Be prepared, and have a plan to extinguish a fire should it escape from the fire pit/barbecue.
- 5. Fires and embers must be extinguished completely when not under constant supervision.
- 6. Fires are only permitted during the following hours:

Sunday-Thursday Prior to 11:00 pm Friday & Saturday Prior to 1:00 am

7. Absolutely no burning in wind speeds above 5 km/hour.
