


OFFICE HOURS

BUILDING AND DEVELOPMENT PERMITS

PERMIT INFORMATION

Whether you are constructing a residence, garage or boathouse on your land, renovating an existing building, operating a home based business or constructing a commercial building a number of permits may be required prior to beginning your project.

DEVELOPMENT PERMITS

A development permit acknowledges the use of land or buildings and its compliance with the applicable Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaw. In almost all cases, an approved development permit is required before commencing any development or use of land in the District. If you begin development without the required approvals, the District has the ability under the Zoning Bylaw to issue a Stop Work Order, or other means of enforcement.

Development Permit Categories:

Permitted Uses:

These uses are intended to be appropriate for the Zoning District in which they are listed and not have major impacts on adjacent land uses. Therefore, District staff appointed as Development Officers approve these applications not the District Council. The Development Officer has the ability to approve, approve with conditions or refuse a permitted use application.

Discretionary Uses:

These uses may have one or more features or potential effects that warrant proposal specific review with a recommendation made to District Council. Discretionary use development permits are reviewed under a set of evaluation criteria included in the Zoning Bylaw.

BUILDING PERMITS

A building permit is separate from a development permit. A building permit refers to building construction and compliance with the National Building Code and is governed by the District Building Bylaw. The District has contracted Professional Building Inspectors, (PBI) as our Building Inspectors.

RESIDENTIAL AND ACCESSORY BUILDINGS

There have been changes to the development permit process and all new residential or accessory building being developed will require a Surveyor's Real Property Report to be completed once the foundation is poured. This is to ensure that the development complies with the required setbacks in the Zoning Bylaw.

Please check the District Website for copies of the Development and Building Permits. If you are planning on doing any slope or leveling of your lot, please contact Gail at the office to ensure that the work will be within the guidelines. Appointments will be booked if you need help with the forms, this is to ensure that the homeowner has had time to fill in the forms, the Development Officer has had time to review the forms, do any research that my be required and ensure proper distancing with COVID 19. Forms and permit information are on the District's website www.katepwabeach.com under the Administration tab.



SNOW REMOVAL POLICY

THAT when deemed necessary, the maintenance supervisor be authorized to contract Corey's Excavating and Maintenance or any other local contractor for snow removal services on district property; and that the snow removal of a residential driveway or a commercial parking lot be the responsibility

of the property owner.




DISCHARGE OF A FIREARM - FIREARMS CARRIERS



 Lockbox located at front door to library
- 2. Katepwa Beach Hotel/Restaurant, Katepwa Beach

 Day Time Access Only (11:00 am 9:00 pm)

 Lockbox located at front door to restaurant
- 3. District Maintenance Quonset, South Katepwa
 Lockbox located at man door (front of bldg)
- 4. From Oct 1st to April 30st at 304 Edwyn Street, Sandy Beach (Private residence)

*Lockbox located on man door to "guesthouse" directly behind residence

From May 1st to September 30th Katepwa Golf Course

*Lockbox located at main entrance to clubhouse

Locations 1, 3, and 4 will be accessible 24/7/365 Location 2 (Katepwa Beach Hotel)is currently available ONLY during daytime hours until notified otherwise

Instructions on accessing the AED units at the 4 locations listed will be as follows:

Upon having made a decision that an AED is required for emergency use, the predetermined protocol must be followed to acquire access at any of the sites.

- 1. Call 911 to report the incident including address/location, requesting access to the closest AED. This will activate response by EMS and provide info to the requester.
- 2. The passcode for the lockbox will then be given to the requester, allowing them access to the key inside, and entry to the location and the AED unit inside that location.
- 3. The AED may then be taken to the location at which it is to be used. The unit is easy to use by simply following the verbal instructions once the top cover is opened.

NOTE: Please ensure that the pickup location is locked prior to leaving with the unit and that the EMO coordinator is notified after use to ensure that the unit is properly serviced prior to be put back in use.

PROPERTY TAX PAYMENTS

Thank you to all of you who have paid your property taxes! For those of you who still need to pay them, the District is still offering 10% off in the months of October and November. If you are using the etransfer way of payment, please note which property you are paying for and what the Roll # is. This way we know which property to pay. Also, if you have an address change or a telephone number change, we need you to provide that to the office as soon as possible.



Bylaw Reminders:

Bylaw No. 2-2019 A Bylaw of the District of Katepwa to Regulate the Operation of Vehicles regarding long term parking on municipal property will be addressed. If you receive a letter from the District it is because you have been identified as a possible owner of items on municipal property, we would encourage you to move any items as the bylaw officer will be out doing inspections and any items found on District property may be towed.

In 2019, the District of Katepwa passed Bylaw No. 2-2019 A Bylaw of the District of Katepwa to Regulate the Operation of Vehicles. For your information, this bylaw was updated as a result of several complaints regarding the storage of vehicles, boats, trailers, lifts etc., on District land which in some cases is directly adjacent to homeowner's properties. It causes maintenance issues, potential liability issues and can become an eyesore. Also, in the District of Katepwa Zoning Bylaw, all residential lots should have 2 off street parking stalls per dwelling unit.

Please ensure all vehicles are stored off district land and your personal vehicles, boats, trailers, campers are parked within your yard. Thank you for your anticipated co-operation.

16. <u>VEHICLES ON PUBLIC RESERVE, ETC.</u>

a.) No person may operate or park a vehicle on any area designated as Public Reserve etc.

b.) The provisions of Subsection (a) shall not apply to maintenance vehicles or vehicles using a designated parking area.

NEWS FROM THE TRAIL




SAWS has developed three questions which we are asking the voters to ask the candidates during this election.
